


How to Get There










Andy Ridley CEO, Citizens of the Reef

FISH HEAD HURRY



Welcome to FISH HEAD HURRY, a social sculpture project by artist Ernest Goh, where the only thing fishy is our dire plastic pollution problem. These piscine protectors aren't just there to gobble up your litter with a smile; they're here to remind us that if we don't protect our oceans, our beloved fish head curry might just come with an extra crunch of plastic. So, let's hurry up and save our seas (and seafood), because no one ordered plastic on the menu.

Meet the Artist: Ernest Goh

Artist and photographer Ernest Goh's practice has been spent looking at the environment and its creatures, trying to understand the complex yet awe-inspiring interconnectivity between our planet and its inhabitants. Ernest Goh founded Ayer Ayer - an ecologically-engaged initiative that reaches out to communities through visual and participatory artworks to further environmental protection and awareness. Ayer Ayer's focus on ocean plastic in the regional waterways of South-East Asia has led to the creation of public art, digital gamification and research projects.

Animals have been close to Anbu's heart since her childhood. She is presently the co-CEO of Animals Concerns Research and Education Society (ACRES) an animal protection organisation that promotes community involvement in addressing animal protection issues and in building partnerships with all related bodies to improve animal welfare.

Cyrena is the Acting Director (Wildlife Management යි Outreach) at the National Parks Board. Her role includes developing and implementing wildlife management policies, while raising awareness about human-wildlife encounters and fostering community engagement.

Jasvic is the Campaign Manager of the Our Wild Neighbours (OWN) initiative - an islandwide, multistakeholder campaign that promotes human-wildlife coexistence. Her journey in wildlife conservation started when she embarked on her art project, titled 'Death by Man' where she actively involved herself in volunteering and working with ACRES as a means to better understand the relationship between people and wildlife.


Dr Charlene Yeong Veterinarian, Mandai Nature & Mandai Wildlife Group






